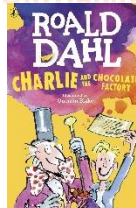
## Hogwarts Novel Studies

### Ravenclaw



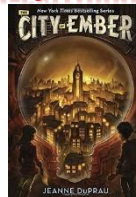

### Hufflepuff



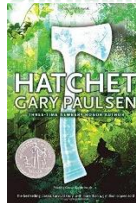
