# The Pirate's Eye Patch: Not Just a Fashion Statement

When you think of a pirate, do you think of a tough guy with an eye patch? No one knows why pirates wore eye patches. But experts like historians and eye doctors have ideas.

Some people think a pirate may have worn an eye patch to cover an injured eye. Pirates could lose an eye in a sword fight or a battle. There were no doctors on pirate ships. The cook would do his best to help. A patch might be used to keep the injured eye from getting infected.

Some experts think pirates wore eye patches to help them see in the dark. Sunlight on the ocean could be bright, and inside the ship would be as dark as night. During a battle, a pirate wouldn't have time to let his eyes adjust to the dark. If you've been in bright sunshine then gone into a dark room, you know what this is like.

If the pirate had a patch over one eye, he could switch the patch to the other eye when he went into the dark ship. The eye that had been covered would be ready to see in the darkness.

Does this really work? The television show *Mythbusters* tried this eye patch trick on a replica pirate ship. It worked! Do you think pirates would have figured this out so long ago?

Some experts think pirates didn't really wear eye patches. Old paintings of pirates often don't show eye patches. Eye patches aren't written about in true stories about pirates. It's only the pirates in made-up stories that have eye patches. Were eye patches just a made-up way to make pirates scary?

What do you think? Did pirates wear eye patches to cover an injured eye or to help them see in the dark? Or did they really even wear eye patches? Maybe we'll never know.

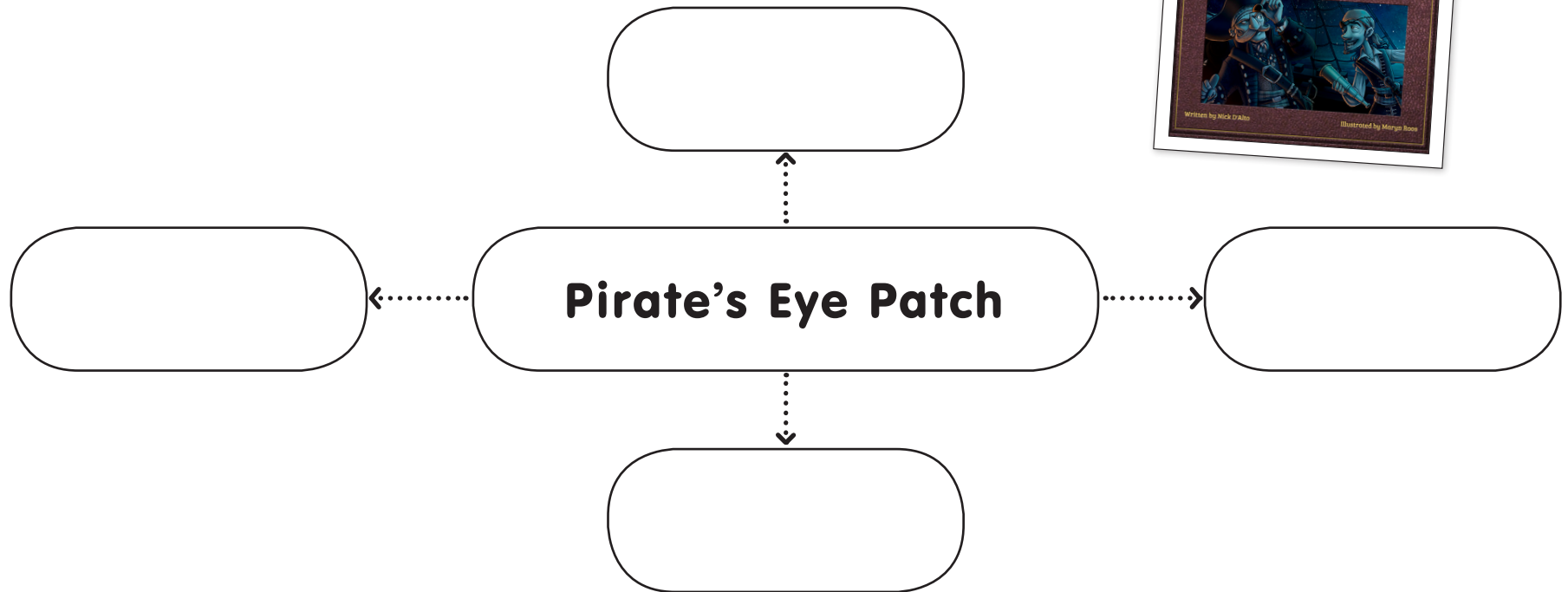
